Road Update. Most everyone is aware that North Range Road received considerable damage vic Range 18 during that last major weather event. The road is completely closed. We are working to gain funding to make this vital repair.

Less well known are future restrictions on Fortune Road. Due to safety arcs from the ASP, Fortune Road will be redesignated as an "On Post Road" and its use is restricted to:

- Installation-related personnel (government employees assigned to the installation for duty, to include permanently assigned government employees to tenant activities, as well as permanently assigned contractor personnel performing official government business) in any vehicle.
- Individuals with a legitimate requirement to access the ASP (Military units receiving or turning-in munitions or personnel either making or taking deliveries of munitions).
- Military units and other activities who require access to Training Areas (TA) 23B, 23C and or 24A.

All other use of Fortune Road or Campbell Road from the ASP to Wilcox Drive is prohibited. Personnel requiring access to Wilcox Barracks or North Range Road are required to use Shackelford Road located approximately 1.5 miles north of Fortune Road on A.P. Hill Drive. These restrictions are reflected in the new FAPH Reg 190-5 (1 Feb 2012).

South Gate ACP. In the next few weeks, South ACP will open for CAC only traffic and ammunition deliveries for extended periods. I based this decision on fiscal constraints (over \$178k annually in NTV mileage costs), employee time in detouring around the installation, and the fact that traffic has been severely restricted on Fortune Road. Balanced with this decision are considerations for Law Enforcement safety and ability to conduct their mission. By no means is this just a "no-brainer" decision; making this work takes deliberate effort from our Law Enforcement officers. Please thank these heroes for everything they do to keep us safe.



Two certain things in life: death and taxes. Due to DHR service reductions, tax assistance will be offered at NSWC Dahlgren in lieu of onsite. Contact Naval Support Activity - South Potomac, Dahlgren, VA 22448-5150, DSN: 249-1839, Phone: 800-500-4947/540-653-1839. Eligibility: Tax Assistance is available to active duty and retired military members and their certain family members. National Guard and Reserve personnel on active duty for thirty days or more are also entitled to tax assistance. Service members who depart the Army under the 15 year early retirement program are not authorized tax assistance services. A valid Uniformed Services Identification Card must be presented to establish eligibility. Gate passes, building passes, security badges, vehicle operators' licenses, etc., are not acceptable. Remember that this service is available on your own time - leave must be taken if you plan to use this service during your regular working hours.
